The Epistle

A newsletter for the Members and Friends of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church

Greetings to you during this Advent and Christmas Season!

I will always be grateful to those who give their time, talents, and treasures here at St. Paul's. I see God at work among us, as I have been touched to hear many stories of faith by those people, I encounter in my ministry among you. I have been blessed to be welcomed into people's lives in both the good times and the bad, and in those moments, to get to know people better and hear how God is present in their lives. Each year in pastoral ministry brings me gratitude for my faith community, and I stand in awe at how God equips and guides us.

There are specific things you can measure to determine the health of a congregation. During our church council meetings, we see many of these specific things through our council reports, such as our income and expenses, our asset balances, how many new members we have received, students affirming their baptism, 3rd graders receiving their bibles, and how many homebound and hospital visits are being made. The list can go on and on. But one indicator that is harder to measure (but is so very critical to the health of the ministry) *is the way people feel about the ministry*. People feel good, bad, and indifferent to many things, but if people don't feel that something good or positive is happening, then moral can go down, and the ministry is impacted. My sense is that the church is to be a place that feels and acts differently, because living the Gospel is very different from the ways we would normally engage with the world and others. This place is to be a refuge, a light on the hill, an island in the sea, and it is to be a place that is filled with love, caring, kindness, generosity, and hospitality. Because Jesus embodied these actions, as his disciples, we are to do likewise.

And so, I pray each day that God will lead us to be bold in our vision and where we are fearful, doubtful, or uncertain we will see the doors that God opens for us. Although things may seem impossible, with God, all things are possible.

Finally, with Sunday being Christmas Eve, the worship and music committee and church council attempted to find the best middle ground for worship times. You will see in this newsletter the times of the Christmas Eve worship services, as well as a simple worship service on Christmas morning. I pray you will find the time to give thanks for the simple joys of life and work toward a loving peace in your hearts for the good of the world. I give thanks to God in my prayers for each of you, and for our shared ministry.

Gracious God, you are before us, inviting us to the promise of your kingdom, you are behind us, moving us to trust your promise. We bless you for your Spirit in our midst. We bless you for the experience of communion. We bless you for the relationships and shared vision growing during these days. Amen.





Come and join us in Christian Fellowship for this informal time to reflect, discuss and learn. Make sure to bring your own lunch!


A Different Advent Calendar!




