Summer is a great time to reframe how God continues to make a claim on the beloved community of the church against all odds. God's persistence in the life of the church is truly a treasure! In our Sunday worship this summer, we will hear accounts of Jesus forming his followers through storytelling and with mighty acts to inspire us to persevere and even flourish. This summer we will hear from the prophet Jeremiah who was compelled to speak even though he had no assurance that his words would have any effect. We pray, O God, that during this summer, you will guide us so that each day we can demonstrate your love, joy, peace, goodness, gentleness, and kindness. 

Building a Culture of Generosity in the Special Account

This segment concludes the 4 part series on Deposit accounts of St Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church. In the previous segments, we have reviewed the 3 major Deposit accounts of Current, Benevolence, and Building and attempted to explain how monies, contributed to these respective accounts, are allocated. The Special account is, just as the name implies, special. Unless you are a contributor who receives weekly offering envelopes, you may have never contributed into the Special deposit account.

The Special account does not appear as one of the weekly offering envelope divisions you will see when you contribute each Lord's Day, yet the Special envelopes are found within the packet of envelopes mailed to parishioners every 2 months. They are not marked "Special," but rather, are the extra envelopes included for Ash Wednesday, Lent, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. Parishioners who contribute through the "Simply Giving" program do not have access to Special envelopes unless they specifically ask for them.

Here at St Paul's, there is no predesignating of where funds received through these Special envelopes will be distributed. Rather, with guidance from the Finance committee at the end of the year, the Church Council directs these monies received into areas of ministry where the budgeted goal may not have been fully achieved that particular year. This flexibility allows the Council to fully fund a ministry goal without the constraint of designated giving to a specific ministry. For example, if St Paul's has a budgeted goal of contributing "X" amount toward Lutheran Disaster Response in a given year and throughout the course of said year only 85% of "X" is achieved, the Church Council can vote to fulfill the remaining 15% from the Special account. That is a really simplified example, but one that should help to explain where these funds originate and where they are distributed.

The Special account also contains funds from several sub-accounts of standing "groups" within St Paul's to avoid each group needing to have their own treasury. Examples of this are the Youth, Kitchen, and Green Team accounts. In addition, whenever extra social or ministry functions are scheduled that include parishioner's individual funds, these monies are held in, and paid from, the Special account. Examples of this are Senior Ministry events like the Iron Pigs outing and the Christmas banquet or the recent refurbishment of the Prayer Garden.

The truth is that St Paul's also has three additional deposit accounts, but I believe their names are self-explanatory and are not accounts where there is routine interaction between any individual parishioner and the account. These are the Memorial account, the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, and the Endowment Fund.

I want to thank you for your solid, generous support of our shared ministry. As the psalmist writes in Chapter 24, verse 1," The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it." That's you and me, folks. All we are and all we have is God's. We are called to be responsible stewards of what has first, been shared with us.





St. Paul's Bible Study takes place on the first and third Thursday each month. Come and join us in Christian Fellowship for this informal time to reflect, discuss and learn.




