There are many “funny” videos about people being surprised, and the reactions of the people surprised are varied based on *the kind of surprise*. The scary surprises are the ones when someone hides behind a door or couch, and suddenly leap out and the surprised person screams. Personally, I don't like those surprises, but I prefer the joyful surprises when a mom or dad serving in the military comes home unexpectedly, appearing at the children's school. When the child sees the parent who has been away, they are surprised with joy, and that to me is the very best surprise.

In pastoral ministry, there are good and bad surprises as well, or better said, good and bad things that happen we do not expect. An unexpected phone call from a church member recently diagnosed with cancer, or a family member who died. Those are the tough moments, and we all have faced them. Just when we think we have life under control, something happens unexpectedly and everything changes. Each morning I come into my church office and see I have phone messages, I hold my breath hoping the message will bring good news and not bad.

Over the last three Sunday's I have been saying this during the announcements:

*“I continue to thank you for your giving to St. Paul's allows for our ministry here in Telford, throughout the Southeastern PA Synod and through all the ministries of the ELCA. If you have not been able to make your offering in some time, I ask you to be mindful and to be surprisingly generous. We love those “good surprises”, and so this week, pray about your blessings, and be moved to make those generous offerings.”*

Believing we are to name and pray for those things we believe are good and pleasing to the Lord, I have been praying for good surprises, because they lift the soul. For just when I start to get discouraged about things, I receive an unexpected phone call from a dear friend, or a kind note sent to support me, or an unexpected gift from an unexpected person. Those moments of unexpected generosity remind me of God's love and the work of the Holy Spirit among us.

On a recent Sunday, St. Paul's received a very generous and unexpected financial contribution from an unknown person. The giving appeared out of nowhere, and I want to share with you how touched I was by it. My heart was lifted, and I rejoiced in the goodness of the Lord, because this church is making a difference not just in this community, but through our shared ministry with the Southeastern PA Synod and Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. So, I take this moment to thank you each of you for your faithful giving to the ministry of St. Paul's, and I look forward to those good surprises which God will provide to this ministry through your generous and loving lives.

# Building a Culture of Generosity in the Building Fund

The preceding 2 segments of this 4 part series about the deposit accounts of St Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, were specifically and individually focused on the Current and Benevolence accounts. One would need to reference the April and May issues of the *EPISTLE* to read them. As I've stated in those articles, this series is being presented in an effort to clear up any misunderstandings that may exist among contributors regarding what each category of your donations supports. This is a refresher for our long time supporters and hopefully informative for folks who have just recently started their faith journey with us and may have come from a church background where all expenses were paid from a single General Operating Fund. This month we will be taking a look at the Building Fund account.

The Building Fund account is unique from our congregation's other accounts, in that it only receives deposits from donations specifically designated as BUILDING. The Building Fund account also only pays one bill, the mortgage. No other expenses are currently paid from this account. Expenses to maintain the physical property are paid from the Current account. 100% of all monies contributed to the Building account through our envelope or direct deposit giving is applied toward our mortgage. At this time, funds cannot be contributed into the Building account through the use of our QR code.

The focus and use of the Building Fund account may change within the next year as St Paul's approaches the complete payment of our mortgage. The fulfillment of the mortgage obligation should be satisfied within this calendar year, which is a wonderful accomplishment and one for which we give God thanks.

There are some major physical plant expenses that St Paul's will need to address in the relative near future. There is discussion, within the Church Council, that once the mortgage obligation is satisfied, we would direct and encourage folks to continue to support the Building Fund and that those donations would be applied toward these major expenses. I would stress, however, that at the time of this writing, the Building funds are only applied to the mortgage. If the application of Building funds changes, the congregation will be notified, in advance, so there is no misappropriation of your donations.

I thank you for your solid, generous support of our Building Fund account. Next month, we will conclude this journey through St Paul's deposit accounts and examine what expenses are covered by the Special account.






