The Epistle

A newsletter for the Members and Friends of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church

I am grateful to be a part of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church and I hope you feel the same way. We have a wonderful church building, committed and loving fellow church members, and so many opportunities for learning, fellowship, and service. We gather at St. Paul's to receive and give love. But we are also part of a very large church, well beyond our doors, and because learning is a part of our Lenten Journey, I am sharing parts of that larger church so as you make your offerings to St. Paul's, you will know that your giving flows out to the needs of many. Here are the many expressions of our church.

Congregations like St. Paul's (www.stpaulstelford.org) are centers for evangelical mission, where people of faith celebrate, learn, and connect with one another and others around the world through service and weekly worship. We are a church of 8,900 congregations across the United States, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. We are the church that shares a living, daring confidence in God's grace. More locally within the life of the Southeastern PA Synod, St. Paul's is part of a collaboration of churches called the Indian Valley Cluster. Those churches are St. Paul's Lutheran, Telford; Grace Lutheran, Hatfield; Emmanuel Lutheran, Souderton, Advent Lutheran Harleysville; and Christ Lutheran, Kulpsville. Cluster Events include shared worship services, local service projects, and fellowship events. St. Paul's is also a part of the Upper Bucks Conference which shares resources among the congregations and provides support to Rostered Leaders. Rev. Erika Wesch of Little Zion Lutheran Church, Telford is the Upper Bucks Conference Dean.

Synods like the Southeastern PA Synod (www.ministrylink.org) are one of 65 synods which vary greatly in size, geography, membership, staffing and program. Our smallest synod has 30 congregations — the largest nearly 300. The synods are grouped into nine regions throughout the United States, which are points of connection for them and the churchwide organization. Synods unite the work of congregations within their areas, serve as regional support, and guide pastoral and other staff candidates, through such things as the Call Process, which led me to serve as your pastor. Bishop Patricia Davenport and her staff, including Pastor Marica Bell, director of synod mobility, strengthen the relationship congregations and their Rostered Leaders.

Churchwide Organization of the ELCA (www.elca.org) is based out of the Lutheran Center in Chicago and functions with the ELCA's 65 synods. It nurtures important connections with Lutheran, ecumenical and interfaith partners, and related organizations. The Churchwide Organization works alongside 27 colleges and universities related to the ELCA, 7 seminaries (such as United Lutheran Seminary), more than 2,000 schools and early childhood education centers, campus ministries, outdoor ministries (such as Bear Creek Camp) social service agencies, (such as ELCA World Hunger, Lutheran Disaster Response and Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services.)

Lutheran World Federation (www.lutheranworld.org) is a network of Lutheran churches throughout the world representing over 75.5 million people covers seven geographic regions and a diverse array of contexts. The Lutheran World Federation promotes justice, peace, reconciliation and dignity for individuals and communities.

It brings me joy to see our connection to our brothers and sisters in Christ, and I am thankful that through our shared ministry, we are never alone.

"ecopalms" for the past six years as a way to promote environmental and social justice on earth.

Did You Know?

- Approximately 308 million palm fronds were consumed in the US in 2020
- Palm purchases for Palm Sunday are worth more than 4.5 million dollars
- Responsible palm gathering protects valuable natural forests
- At least half of the farmers of the Central Peten of Guatemala earn additional income from harvesting palm fronds and more than one quarter of household heads support themselves entirely by collecting fronds
- Each palm plant produces 2 to 5 harvestable leaves in a 4 month period.

Why a "Fair Trade" palm?

- To improve income and living conditions in the indigenous communities that harvest the palms
- To protect the palm trees and important forests from which they are gathered through sustainable harvest programs

How does this promote Environmental Stewardship?

By managing a responsible palm harvest, the local forest is protected and the communities within, increase their income and provide a sustainable income source without damaging the environment

How does this promote Social Justice?

- Generally, harvesting palms is a volume based enterprise involving a "middle man" without regard to the prices paid the gatherers for their labor
- By purchasing "Fair Trade" palm fronds, the gatherers receive the income directly from the purchasers, increasing their standard of living by raising household incomes and eliminating the "middle man"
