Building a Culture of Generosity in the Benevolence Fund

For the first part of this 4 part series about the deposit accounts of St Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, which highlighted the Current account, I would refer you to the April issue of the *EPISTLE*. As a reminder, this series is being presented in an effort to clear up any misunderstandings that may exist among contributors regarding what each category of your donations supports. This is a refresher for our long time supporters and hopefully will be informative for folks who have just recently started their faith journey with us and may have come from a church background where all expenses were paid from a single General Operating Fund. This month we will be taking a look at the Benevolence account.

The Benevolence account receives deposits from several different designations, but the major focus of this account is our congregation's apportionment. 100% of all monies contributed to the Benevolence account through our envelope or direct deposit giving is applied toward our apportionment. At this time, funds cannot be contributed to Benevolence through the use of our QR code. If the word "apportionment" is foreign to you, let me attempt to explain what, where, and why this exists.

Apportionment, for lack of a better example, is like an assessment. As a member congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), St Paul's is given a target apportionment figure, based on our confirmed membership. It's a figure that represents our "portion" of the funding needed to sustain the national church organization (ELCA) and local (Southeastern Pennsylvania) synod. The apportionment funds are split 50/50 between the local and national governing bodies. Our apportionment is \$30,000. St Paul's can be extremely proud of the fact that we have met our apportionment figure every year for many, many years. It's a testament to our calling as Lutheran Christians to live out our faith in this way.

The apportionment funds pay for all staff expenses on the national and local levels of the governing bodies: the bishops and their assistants, the office staff, the various agencies (think World Hunger, Disaster Response, Child and Family Services, just to name a few) the church oversees, as well as, mobility (the process of supplying pastors to congregations in transition, i.e. Pastor Coleman coming to St Paul's), vitality, missions, advocacy and justice, Youth Ministry events, Synod and National Assembly, and the list goes on. Because these offices are fully funded through apportionment, when one donates to something like Lutheran Disaster Response, 100% of that donation is sent directly to folks affected by the disaster. We have all witnessed, first-hand, the positive effect that being a member of a larger church body can have on a local congregation. Thanks be to God for the work these governing bodies do on our behalf!

Monies contributed specifically to the Lutheran Community at Telford through your envelopes is also tracked and passed on from the Benevolence account. Special appeals to World Hunger, a specific disaster, or national/local church agency or event, like the Bear Creek Camp Appeal on the second Sunday in March, are also deposited into and paid out of this account.

I'm sure that I probably have failed to address one or two items that are covered by the Benevolence account, but I hope you have a better understanding of that for which this account pays. I thank you for your solid, generous support of our Benevolence. Next month, we will continue this journey and examine what expenses are covered by the Building account.




Easter Wondering and Wandering Walks
