A newsletter for the Members and Friends of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church

I was speaking to a colleague the other day about the faithful work of ministry that hospital chaplains do, and it got me thinking about my time as a chaplain at the hospital in Gettysburg PA during my seminary years. Chaplains are called to walk with people during difficult moments of their lives and to offer prayers and comfort. Chaplains serve in such places as fire and police departments, nursing homes, and hospitals, and while there are sudden tragedies in all these places, hospital chaplains experience the constant of human struggle. I marvel at hospital chaplains because they have gifts for ministry I do not have. When I served as a hospital chaplain and entered a room filled with tears and hurt, I felt so uncertain of my place in that setting, because I didn't have a relationship with the patient or family members. I didn't know them, and they didn't know me. So many times, I felt I was invading their private space, and other times, I felt my presence was not welcomed, as the patient or family members (I later learned) had bad experiences with a faith community.

I share this because it affirms my calling to pastoral ministry here at St. Paul's. I began my call as your pastor on August 29, 2021, and for these past two years I have had the time and opportunities to get to know you, and you get to know me, and because of that relationship we can walk with each other in joy and sorrow. I am sure by now you have figured out how much I value building and working on relationships, not just between me and you, but the relationships you have with one another. I pray each day for this community of faith, that the Lord will gather us together to grow in our relationship with the Lord and with one another.

As you will see in this newsletter there are many opportunities for relationship building. If you have been away from St. Paul's for some time, please consider coming back. You will be warmly welcomed! We begin a new church ministry year with much excitement and energy. Our Worship and Music, Evangelism, and Christian Education committees have been planning over the summer to strengthen our community and the ministry we share. Your presence and the gifts you offer make a big difference. I am looking forward to the strengthening of our relationships with one another during this new ministry year!

After the Children's Message, kids will be invited to age-appropriate classes to further dig into the week's Bible story.




