FIRST READING: Acts 10:34-43


Peter crosses the immense religious and social boundary that separates Jews from Gentiles in order to proclaim the good news of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, so that God's forgiveness in Jesus' name would reach out to all people.

<sup>34</sup>Peter began to speak to the people: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, 35but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. <sup>36</sup>You know the message he sent to the people preaching Christ—he is of Israel. peace by Jesus Lord <sup>37</sup>That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: <sup>38</sup>how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all oppressed by the God was devil, for with <sup>39</sup>We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; <sup>40</sup>but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, <sup>41</sup>not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. 42He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. <sup>43</sup>All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

#### **SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11**

The core of the Christian faith and Paul's preaching is the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. As the crucified and risen Christ appeared to the earliest of his followers, so we experience the presence of the Risen One in the preaching of this faith.

#### A reading from 1 Corinthians.

<sup>1</sup>Now I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, <sup>2</sup>through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain.


<sup>3</sup>For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, <sup>4</sup>and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, <sup>5</sup>and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. <sup>6</sup>Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. <sup>7</sup>Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. <sup>8</sup>Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. <sup>9</sup>For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. <sup>10</sup>But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them—though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. <sup>11</sup>Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

Look, there is the place they laid him. <sup>7</sup>But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." <sup>8</sup>So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.



Hear our prayers for those who are sick or grieving (especially). Console us with the promise that everything can become new. Merciful God, C: receive our prayer.

A: Your love comes to us when a table is set and a feast is prepared. Bless the feeding ministries of this congregation especially St. Paul's Blessing Box. Bring an end to hunger in our community and around the world. Merciful God, C: receive our prayer.

A: Let us see that the seed of faith that we sow in life, brings abundance and life. Stir in us a desire to give our financial gifts and our time to this ministry. Move us to see the ways we come to trust you in the ways that we give. Bring forth from buried seed an abundant harvest. Merciful God, C: receive our prayer.

A: Guide St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church in supporting and walking with the families of our children and youth. Lead us in providing them support to live out their baptismal promises; to bring them to the word of God and the holy supper, to place in their hands the holy scriptures so they may learn to trust in you, and to nurture them in faith and prayer. Merciful God, **C: receive our prayer.** 

A: We gather this morning to say thank you for our many blessings. Thank you for the gift of life, the preciousness of our relationships, the food and shelter you give us each day, and for the resurrection of Jesus! Merciful God, C: receive our prayer.






#### **PREFACE**


Remembering his love for us on the way, at the table, and at the end, we proclaim the mystery of faith. C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
